according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North Half of the North West Quarter of Section three, and the South East Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section four, in Township eight South, of Range nine West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Little Rock, Arkansas, containing one hundred and eleven acres and thirteen hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tracts have been purchased by the said Marion Zellner,

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Marion Zellner

and to his heirs, the said tracts above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Marion Zellner

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
