
William Ashford Nabours was the son of Jeremiah Nabours and Mary Etta Stewart. William's parents were married in Pickens County, Alabama in 1836, and moved to Itawamba County, Mississippi, where William was born, January 30, 1839. Jeremiah was a Methodist Preacher. The family moved from Mississippi to Bell County, Texas in 1849, then in 1850 moved to Washington County, Texas. Sometime in the early 1850's the family moved to Milam County, Texas, where some of their descendants still live. In 1861 William enlisted in Company G, Fifth Texas Infantry, and fought in Civil War. He fought in every major battle with Hood's Brigade, and was with General Lee when he surrendered at Appomatox. William and Eliza Zellner were married January 01, 1873, in the Nabours home near Cameron. William was a farmer, and served two terms as County Treasurer for Milam County, Texas. In the last few years of his life, William was living in Santa Anna, Coleman County, Texas with his grandson Lee Woodward. He went to New Mexico to visit his daughter Dora and became ill. He returned to Texas and died in Temple, Bell County, August 22, 1922. William, Eliza, and William's parents, Jeremiah and Mary Nabours, are buried in Salem-Wilson Cemetery, south of Cameron, Milam County, Texas.






